

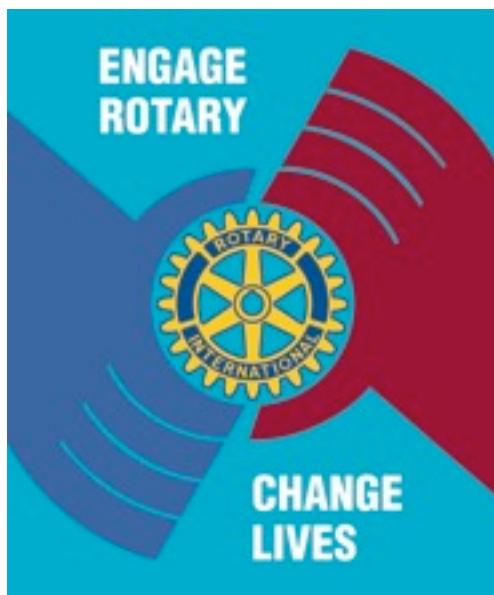

The letter that follows was recently received in an email from Chad Stutsman (Annual Giving Officer for Zones 29, 30, & 31| The Rotary Foundation) to District Governor Norm Jones and the District Rotary Foundation Committee. I have made some editing changes to allow the membership to download these reports-PDG Larry Thompson

Dear DG Jones and District 6460 Team,

We are nearly there! There are less than 2 weeks left in this Rotary year. I know many of you are busy with the district's end of the year business. To help close out these final weeks I have attached May's monthly reports. Additionally, following are some updates for Annual Fund Goals, Non-contributing clubs, Club Banner information, and Paul Harris Society Changes.

### Attachments

1. [Paul Harris Society Report](#)- Provides a list of a district Paul Harris Society members and eligibility for the last 4 Rotary years.
2. [District Fundraising Profile](#)- Provides the district's giving history for Annual Fund, Endowment Fund and total giving. Also includes history for Annual Fund goals, Benefactors, Bequest Society Members, Major Donors, Major Gifts, and Paul Harris Society Eligible.
3. [Club Fundraising Analysis](#)- Provides annual fund goals, annual giving and total giving history, membership, EREY, Sustaining Member, and PHS Eligible totals of the club of the past 5 years.
4. [Annual Fund Banner Recognition Status Report](#)- Displays a club's 2013-14 Rotary year progress towards becoming an Every Rotarian, Every Year Club (EREY), a 100% Rotary Foundation Sustaining Member Club, and the Top Three Per Capita in Annual Fund Giving banner recognition.

### [Annual Fund Contribution](#)

Since the 1st of July to the end of May, this Rotary year, about **25%** of your Rotarians has contributed **\$168,042.59** to the Annual Fund with a **-20%** year to date change compared to the end of May last Rotary year. The Rotary year is coming to an end but there is still time to encourage your Rotarians to support their Annual Fund. It's with Rotarian support of the Annual Fund that great Rotarian led initiatives better lives! ### [Rotary Club Banner Recognition](#)

As this Rotary year comes to a close please take a look at the attached Annual Fund Banner Recognition Status Report and encourage clubs to achieve EREY or Sustaining member banners. This is a great resource to find those clubs that are only a few Rotarians away from achieving a club banner. Advise your club presidents and club foundation chairs to use their EREY Eligibility Report (accessed through [My Rotary](#) on [Rotary.org](#)) to see club members that are EREY and Sustaining member. Following is a quick reminder about the banners-

**The Every Rotarian Every Year Banner** is awarded to clubs that achieve a minimum US\$100 per capita giving and 100 percent participation with every active (dues paying) member contributing some amount to the Annual Fund during the Rotary year.

**The 100% Rotary Foundation Sustaining Member Club Banner** is achieved when every active (dues paying) member of the club must personally contributes \$100 or more to the Annual Fund during the Rotary year.

### **Non-Contributing Clubs? Nope Future Giving Clubs!**

The term non-contributing club refers to clubs that have not yet contributed to the Annual Fund this Rotary year. I am not a big fan of the non-contributing club name. I believe starting with a negative term will not inspire giving to the Annual Fund. I prefer to emphasize the possibility of club giving I use the term Future Giving Clubs. Most often clubs have not contributed yet because their club treasurer has not yet sent in member contributions. This is easily solved with a friendly reminder to the club leadership team. Unfortunately, there are those clubs that do not contribute because they lack information, inspiration, and engagement with the Annual Fund. These clubs are tougher nuts to crack. Begin by engaging with them. What projects are they interested in? What good works are they doing? Finally, show how the Annual Fund and their club goals align. Ultimately, these clubs want to do good works. They are not alone. A global community of Rotarians would like to help.
