Just finished visit number 43 of the 2013 Rotary eating tour and need to start that diet ASAP! Being out with the clubs is the greatest thing about being District Governor. Clubs small and large, active to very active, local communities to international service, all special in their own way. Being a member of a smaller club it has always seemed logical that when we did a service project it was all members or nothing. As a consequence our club does about 6 or 7 service projects a year. Pretty good for a club our size. But in my travels I have found some clubs that are doing 35 plus projects a year. How do they do that you ask? Are they a club with over 100 members? The answer is no, they look at service projects in a smaller scale. 4 members might do one project, 4 other doing another project, 4 in a third project and so on. It doesn't have to be all or nothing. Two really good things come out of this kind of thinking.

1. Club members have time for their service, yet there is time for their other interests.
2. The club gets 35 plus opportunities to expose Rotary and their club to the local community.

Please consider all the opportunities your community has for service, do a little here and a little there, and watch how your club exposure can grow.

She followed on the footsteps of her maternal Grandfather and Father, both of whom were past Rotary Club Presidents in Massachusetts. In fact her Grandfather founded the RC Chelsea, Ma. in 1927.

Barbara assumed numerous Club positions and became President of her first Club in 1997/98. Along the way she accepted District responsibilities, founded two Clubs and actually served as President for two Clubs, she rose to DG in 2005/2006.

In late 2007 following the death of a Grandchild, she moved to Greenville ,SC to be close to her Daughter and family. She joined the RC Pleasantburg(in Greenville). She was been a D#7750, Zone#33 District Fundraiser, Polio Plus Chair and looks forward to



becoming the Chair of RAGS and Fellowships.

Barbara holds an A.B. degree from Suffolk Univ. and an M.A. from Northeastern Univ.

Professionally she has been a tireless worker in the non-profit field. She has assisted graduating college students with career development, resettled refugees, worked in a shelter for homeless families, planned events, done direct fundraising, and assisted at a low-income neighborhood

community educational and recreational center.

She is a sought after Rotary Motivational Speaker who in the past year has spoken in Florida, California, North Carolina and South Carolina. She speaks on about ten different Rotary topics, often incorporating humor to get her point across.

Currently she has attended ten RI Conventions 11 Zone 33/34 Conferences and serves on the Executive Committee for the RI Past Officer Reunion that meets each year in San Diego. In addition to RGHF, she belongs to the RI Wine Appreciation Fellowship, the RAG on Hunger and Nutrition, and the Fellowship of P.Rotary Officers. Currently she is working on a RAG concerning human trafficking and a Peace Conference to take place in Greenville in 2014.

Barbara is a member of the Bequest Society, a Benefactor and a multiple Paul Harris Fellow.
